Subject Statement

PE is a part of the Foundation Subjects. The children will receive on average 2 hours PE per week. This is to ensure that the children have the opportunities to develop their physical well-being as well as their educational well-being. The children are encouraged to try a variety of sports and games so that they might find a sport with which they engage and participate with it outside school as well as inside school. As well as the PE provided as part of the curriculum the children also have opportunities after school and during lunchtimes to develop their love of PE.

Mr Young is the PE lead. He arranges for competitive sport participation and works with providers on the Island to broaden the experience of PE within the school. This has included Chance to Shine PE and Skipping workshops as well as PE matches across the Island.

The Government recognises the importance of PE within the educational life of the children and therefore has focused funding for this particular area. The School holds Sports Days each year. KS1 sports days enable all the children to participate in field and track events. KS2 work with the local Secondary school who run our traditional sports day for them. The school also takes part in the Newport Olympics which is run by Medina High School and is attended by Years 5 & 6.

After School clubs include football, dance and multi-skills. There are also opportunities for Tennis and Cricket at appropriate times.
